

 - August 2009




California High Speed Rail

Ballpark - Key Dates

June 22 - Informational Report (CED)

July 2 - Release of Economic and Environmental studies

August 4 – City Council Meeting

November 3 – Public Vote

Ballpark Guiding Principles

- 1. The stadium must generate a significant economic benefit to San Jose and have a positive impact on the City of San Jose's General Fund
- 2. The Major League Baseball team, at no cost to the City of San Jose, will be responsible for financing and building the stadium and improvements on the approximately 14-acre designated stadium site

Ballpark Guiding Principles

- 3. The Major League Baseball team will be responsible for financing all stadium operating costs related to its activities within the stadium site and surrounding area.
- 4. The name of the Major League Baseball team must include San Jose.

Ballpark Guiding Principles

5. If the City or Redevelopment Agency recommend a contribution in the form of land or a financial contribution for any other ballpark specific items, a vote by the citizens of San Jose will be required on the stadium project.
