Project: McEnery Children's Park

Description: McEnery Children's Park encompassing approximately one acre of land, is set within the greenbelt of Guadalupe River Park and Gardens. It is a leisure area for families, children, and Downtown workers.

Location: San Fernando Street (east of the Guadalupe River)

Benefit: McEnery Park is one of a string of recreational opportunities at the Guadalupe River Park and Gardens. At the edge of the Downtown core, the green open space of the park provides a welcome respite from the business of the City.

Features:

- Meandering water feature representing the history of rivers
- Sand play area
- Controlled streamline
- Restrooms
- Play equipment
- Picnic tables and benches surrounded by trees
