Project: O.B. Whaley Elementary School Field Improvements

Description: The O.B. Whaley Elementary School Field is located in the West Evergreen Strong Neighborhoods Initiative (SNI) Area. The project was identified as one of the 'Top 10' priorities by the West Evergreen Strong Neighborhood residents. The four-acre project site is designated as a joint-use school and community field, which will be used by students during the day, and will be open to the community on weekends and after regular school hours.

Benefit: The project will provide students and the community with new recreation space, including a renovated baseball diamond, which improves access to a playing field for local community sports leagues.

Features:

- Renovated baseball diamond and field with new bleachers
- Children's play structure
- Pedestrian pathways
- New landscaping and irrigation system

Total Costs: \$925,000
\$500,000 from the San Jose Redevelopment Agency
\$200,000 from San José City Council District 7 funds
\$225,000 from the Evergreen Elementary School District
