Project: Zolezzi Park Improvements

Project Description: Zolezzi Park, located in East San Jose, was identified as a neighborhood priority in the Gateway East Neighborhood Improvement Plan approved by the San Jose City Council in June 2003. The project includes upgraded playground equipment, a half basketball court, outdoor fitness stations for seniors, and new pedestrian pathways connecting the senior housing area to King Road.

Location: Southwest corner of King Road and Hermocilla Way
Gateway East Strong Neighborhood Area

Benefit: The park improvement design improves the functionality of the park and encourages inter-generational use by offering more recreational opportunities for children, families, and seniors. The project enhances the attractiveness of the neighborhood and park with new and improved facilities.

Features:

- Upgraded play equipment with new resilient surface play area
- Decomposed granite pedestrian pathway with five wellness stations for exercise and stretching
- A basketball half-court
- Additional benches and picnic tables
- 16 trees
- New turf
- Irrigation/landscape and drain improvements
- New wood chips throughout the planting areas

Total Costs: \$ 540,000 from San Jose Redevelopment Agency
